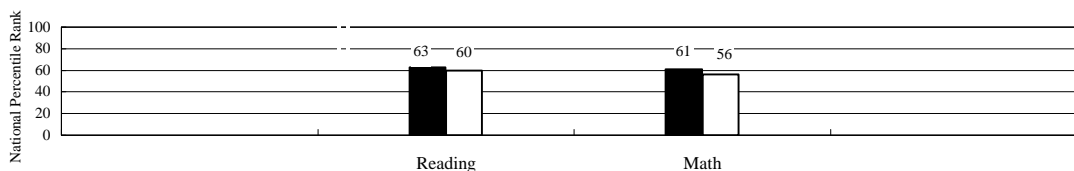

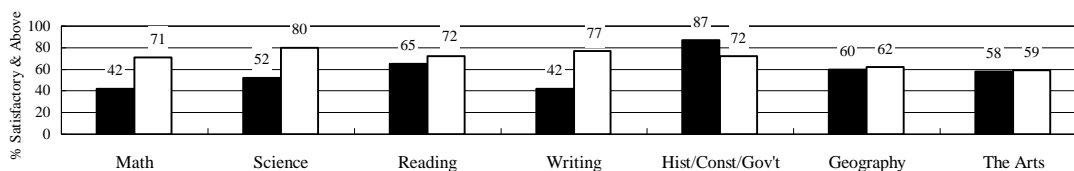
3rd Grade Stanford Achievement Tests, 9th Edition - "Traditional" Students

% Tested as "Trad.": Site: 86% State: 85%

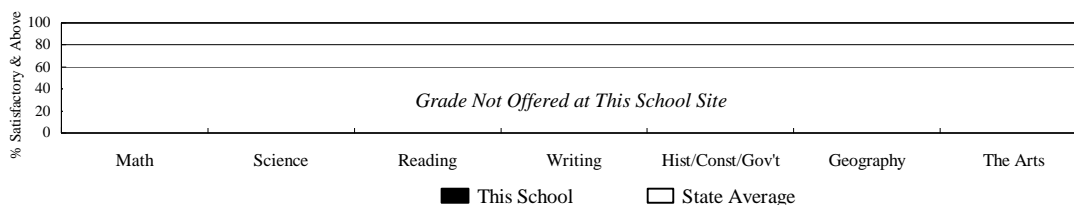


5th Grade Oklahoma Core Curriculum Test - "Traditional" Students
